Fascinating Program—Gary Kramer, a retired veterinarian, gave an in-depth look at Badger State Ethanol and its progress over the past 20 years. The plant grinds 90,000 bushels of corn a day, 7 days a week. The corn oil produced in most valuable, with ethanol, carbon dioxide, and myriad 'value added' products in the mix. The company gives back to area communities by attending fairs and purchasing animals. He estimates they have purchased more than 500 animals to date.






