

The meeting was called to order by President Stacy at 1201

Secretaries Report-To accept moved by Dave, second by Amanda to accept report as emailed, passed.

Treasurer's report-The Foundation account has \$6,392.52, Administrative account balance \$951.52.

Activities \$39,442.25 Dave moved the report be accepted, second by David and passed.

#### Funding Requests-

The Child Advocacy Center came back with a specific need for their new addition. After some discussion, Dave proposed we give \$5000 for the wheelchair ramp wall, second by Amanda and passed.

Beth moved we give \$300 to the MHS Post-Prom committee for event expenses, second by Linda and passed.

Danielle proposed giving MMS Student Council \$100 for state convention sponsorship hosting expenses, second by Luke and passed with David and Stacy abstaining.

Dave moved that we donate one scholarship of \$1127 to Camp Waubeek to be split between two recipients from Green County, second by Beth and passed.

Committee Reports -Reports from active committees:

Club meetings/House - Luke has scheduled speakers through May

Fundraising: Paperwork has been submitted for the ice cream stand at the fair. There is candy money still to be collected.
